## Whole family extension imperative for dairy-beef value chain: Khizar Hayat

Community of Practice meeting under Dairy-Beef project held online. Dairy-Beef Project is a joint initiative between UVAS Lahore and University of Melbourne, Australia under the Australian Centre for International Agricultural Research and "Aik Saath" program through Whole Family Extension Approach (WFEA). ACIAR Australia is funding a research program worth AUD 3 million to improve small holder dairy and beef profitability thereby enhancing farm production and value chain management in Punjab and Sindh. Online session was attended by public sector officials from Punjab and Sindh, small holder farmers, extension workers and project leadership from Australia and Pakistan. Dr. David McGill, Project Leader, briefed the participants about project activities and achievements. Speaking on the occasion, Mr. Khizar Hayat; Additional Secretary (Admin) L&DD Punjab, appreciated the whole family approach, adopted by the project team, in engaging maximum number of small holders in their extension work.
